## NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 18-88

August 15, 2018

Petition of Liberty Utilities (New England Natural Gas Company) Corp. d/b/a Liberty Utilities for approval of its Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Factors for the 2018-2019 Peak Period, November 1, 2018, through April 30, 2019.

On August 3, 2018, Liberty Utilities (New England Natural Gas Company) Corp. d/b/a Liberty Utilities ("Company") filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") for approval of its revenue decoupling adjustment factors ("RDAFs"), for effect November 1, 2018. This filing was made pursuant to <u>Liberty Utilities (New England Natural Gas Company) Corp.</u>, D.P.U. 15-75 (2016); and the Company's revenue decoupling adjustment clause ("RDAC") tariff, M.D.P.U. No. 1025G. The RDAC allows the Company to modify, on a semi-annual basis, its base distribution rates as a result of changes in customer usage, in order to promote the efficient deployment of demand resources. D.P.U. 10-114, at 33. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 18-88.

The Company proposes RDAF charges of \$0.0407 per therm for residential customers, \$0.0304 per therm for commercial and industrial low-load customers, and \$0.0275 per therm for commercial and industrial high-load customers, effective November 1, 2018 through April 30, 2019. As a result of the proposed changes to the RDAF, the average residential heating customer using 122 therms per month during the peak period will experience a bill increase of \$0.96 or 0.53 percent as compared to the previously effective peak RDAF. The Company states that the average monthly bill impact for all rate classes at each class's average use will range from an increase of 0.15 percent to an increase of 0.70 percent as compared to last year's peak period RDAF.
