NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 20-GAF-O6 March 30, 2020

Petition of Liberty Utilities (New England Natural Gas Company) Corp. d/b/a Liberty Utilities pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.00 for approval of its 2020 off-peak gas adjustment factor filing, effective May 1, 2020.

On March 17, 2020, Liberty Utilities (New England Natural Gas Company) Corp. d/b/a Liberty Utilities ("Company") filed with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") its off-peak gas adjustment factor ("GAF"), pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.00. The filing includes the Company's off-peak GAF for effect May 1, 2020 through October 31, 2020, as well as the reconciliation of its 2019 off-peak period gas costs. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 20-GAF-O6.

The Company submitted a proposed off-peak GAF of \$0.1523 per therm. If the Department approves the Company's GAF as proposed, a typical residential heating customer will see an average monthly bill increase of \$1.13, or 2.99 percent, compared to the 2019 off-peak period. For specific bill impacts, please contact the Company as shown below.

The Company may, at any time during the off-peak period, submit an amended GAF filing. The amended GAF filing must be submitted seven business days before the first billing cycle of the month in which it is proposed to take effect.

The Department will accept written comments on the Company's off-peak GAF. Any person interested in commenting on this matter may submit written comments no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Monday, April 13, 2020**. At this time, all filings will be submitted only in electronic format in recognition of the difficulty that parties and the Department may have filing and receiving original copies. On March 10, 2020, Governor Baker issued a state of emergency related to COVID-19 for the entire Commonwealth. Ordinarily, all parties would follow Sections B.1 and B.4 of the Department's Standard Ground Rules (D.P.U. 15-184-A, App. 1 (March 4, 2020)); however, until further notice, parties must retain the original paper version and the Department will later determine when the paper version must be filed with the Department Secretary. Importantly, all large files submitted must be broken down into electronic files that do not exceed 20 MB.

All documents must be submitted to the Department in electronic format using the following method: by e-mail attachment to peter.ray@mass.gov and andrew.w.strumfels@mass.gov. The text of the e-mail must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 20-GAF-O6); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department's website as soon as practicable at http://www.mass.gov/dpu. To the extent a person or entity wishes to submit comments in accordance with this Notice, electronic submission, as detailed above, is sufficient. A paper copy of the filing will not be available for public viewing at the Company's offices or the Department due to the state of emergency.
